Basics Samples:

- Stitching samples-straight, circular, square, spiral curvilinear & chevours
- Seams and seam finishes plain, lap, run and fell & Mantua maker, counter hem piped, pinking, over locking & turned & stitched.
- Bastings-Straight (running and tacking) Diagonal, tailor's tack

Jung



- Hemming Vertical (Invisible) Slanting (Visible) lips stitching, blind stitching.
- Facings & Bindings round, square, 'V' shape and shaped necklines.
- Plackets and Fastness Two piece (Kurta placket and Blouse placket) one piece, extended, bodice, Zipper, placket.
- Fullness treatment gathers into a band, Shirring, Smocking, tucks, darts, pleats.
